- Space changes allowed pictures to be added

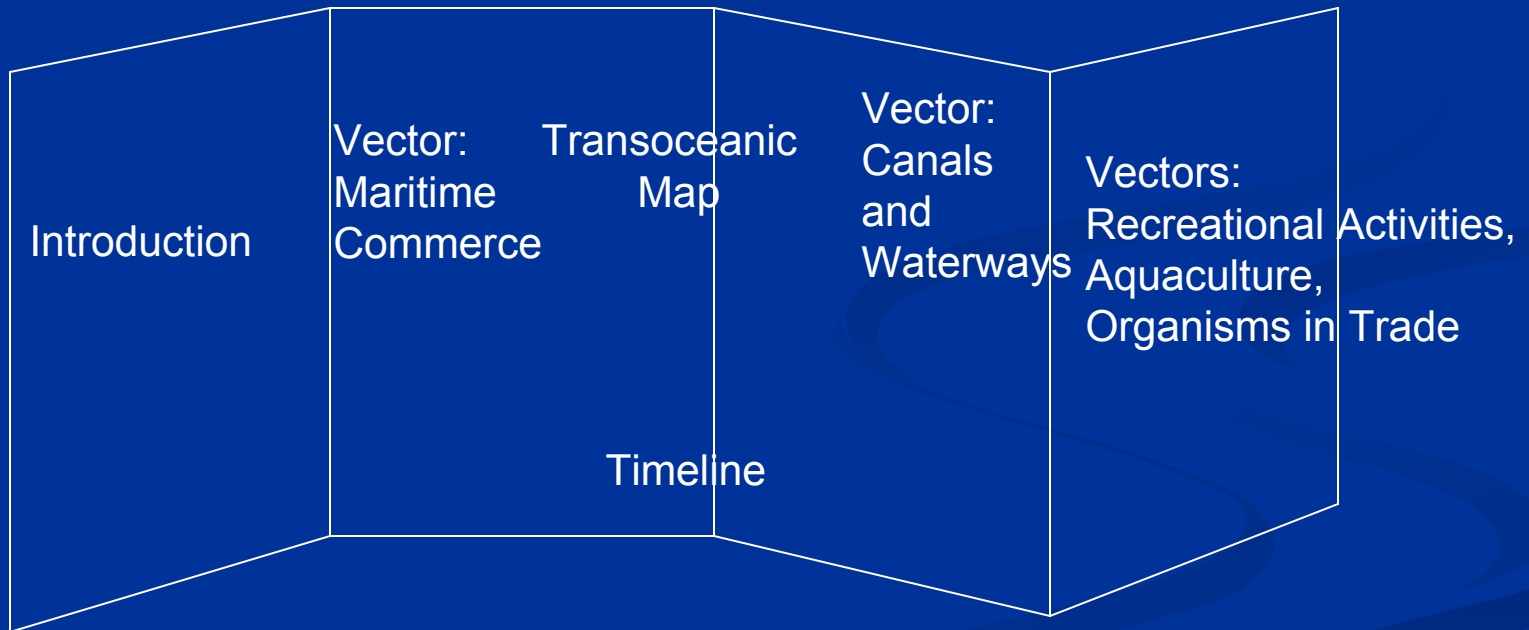
Recommendation/Changes

- Following internal review it was suggested to consider other options for the layout such as a fold-out or pamphlet.

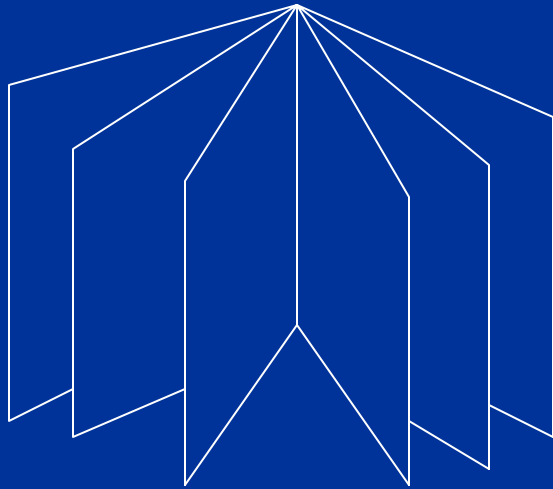
Current Layout



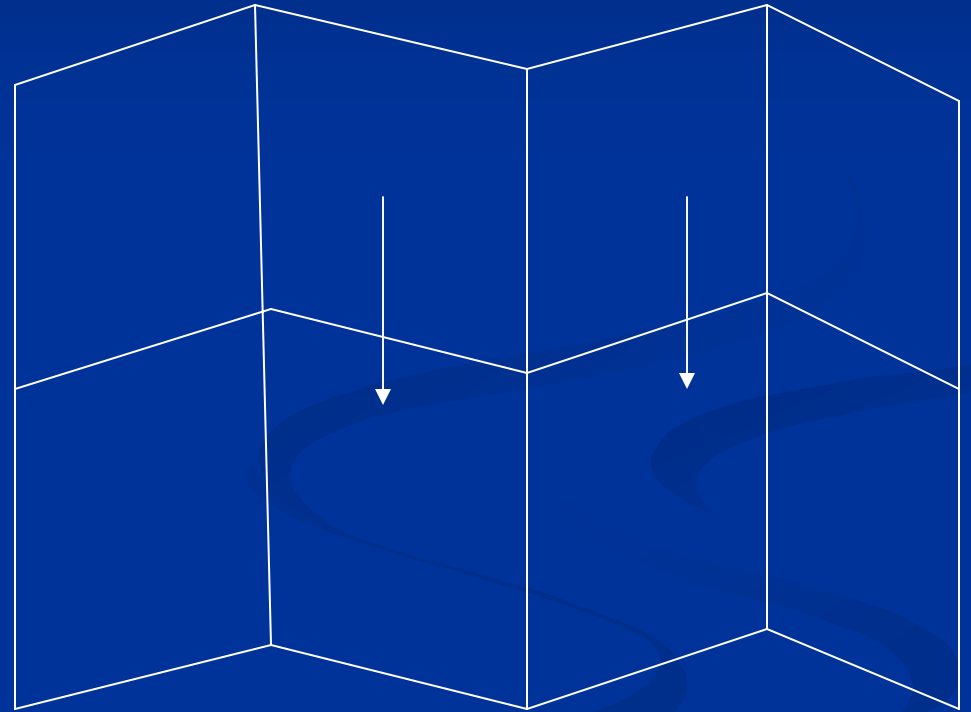
Current Layout
